

'LIGHT UP AND GLOW' TECHNOLOGY ASSISTS BRAIN SURGERY

In a darkened theatre with the windows covered, neurosurgeon Dr Rob Campbell performed Mater's first fluorescence assisted resection on a brain tumour.

Suitable for patients with high grade glioma, the surgery involves the use of a drug which causes malignant areas of brain tissue to 'light up and glow' a red-pink colour during surgery while healthy brain tissue appears blue.

Taken by patients with water three to four hours prior to surgery, the active substance in Gliolan is aminolevulinic acid—a photoreceptive compound absorbed by the tumour cells in the brain and converted by enzymes into fluorescent chemicals.

Dr Campbell said Gliolan enabled him to clearly see the tumour and better visualise the boundaries between cancerous and healthy brain tissue with the use of a specially modified neurosurgical microscope fitted with a blue operating light.

"It delivered everything that it promised; it delivered a better understanding of just how hard it is to separate residual diseased tissues from normal brain tissue and enabled me to better determine what to remove/resect," he said.

"Before we could only estimate the margin between ordinary and tumorous brain cells by what I could see under our operating microscope.

"With this technology, the prospects are now open for us to



apply that treatment to more and more patients, to give them maximum resection and therefore a chance for a more positive outcome," Dr Campbell said.

Gliolan is not yet approved by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) however Melbourne-based biopharmaceutical company, Specialised Therapeutics Australia, has submitted an application to the TGA for approval and anticipates a decision by the end of the year.

The drug is currently made available to Australian neurosurgeons via the Commonwealth Government's Special Access Scheme.

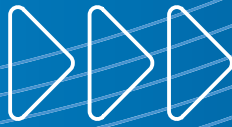

Patients can call in orders, including special dietary requirements such as low-salt, low-sugar, gluten-free, anytime from 6.30 am to 7 pm.

Meals are made-to-order and are delivered by special 'Dining Hosts' within 45 minutes.

"By offering patients this flexibility, they can arrange their meals around appointments, visits or procedures and also eat at a similar time to when they're at home which helps keep medication routines on track," Mr Murray said.

Patients can choose from a wide range of options such as customised omelettes, caesar salad with smoked salmon, a healthy burger from the grill, pizza and pan seared sirloin steak with red wine jus.
