# MRCCC provides confidential and specialised healthcare for people of refugee and asylum seeker background.

### Services provided

- · free health service
- professional interpreters are provided at no cost to the patient
- specialised primary health care assessment and management. This includes refugee health GP and nursing assessment, recommended pathology, and catch-up immunisation as required
- · long appointments with nursing and medical staff
- health care coordination for many different health needs (e.g. oral health, optometry)
- specialist referrals as required
- weekly adult psychiatric clinic
- fortnightly paediatric clinic
- · monthly cardiac clinic.



#### **Eligibility**

People from refugee or refugee-like background with:

- complex health needs
- · significant financial and social barriers to care.

Patients with Medicare will be referred back to their GP for ongoing care where appropriate.

Asylum seekers without Medicare will be provided with long term primary health care.

Once a referral form is received, MRCCC will contact the patient to book an appointment time.

MRCCC is guided by Mater Values and receives input from the Refugee Health Advisory Group (G11). This group of community representatives are from 11 different refugee backgrounds.
